

Fast Facts ⓘ Currigee Mooring Area

ABOUT: The Currigee Mooring Area is a category 3 area located in the waterway on the south western side of South Stradbroke Island within the Designated Mooring Area (DMA) in the Moreton Bay Marine Park.

CURRENT MOORINGS IN THE AREA: Twenty-nine (29) traditional swing moorings.

FUTURE CAPACITY: The Gold Coast Waterways Authority has identified that this site may potentially allow the establishment of up to forty-five (45) environmentally friendly swing moorings. Because of its location and the obligations for vessel owners under marine safety legislation, this mooring area is only practical for use by local residents of the island.

IMPORTANT: The 2014 Buoy Mooring Review identified certain instances where GCWA buoy mooring areas do not align with Designated Mooring Areas within the Moreton Bay Marine Park and/or with the current management of declared Fish Habitat Areas. GCWA and Department of National Parks, Sport and Racing (NPSR) are working together to resolve these issues, which involves a legislative review process by NPSR. In the interim, GCWA is unable to grant new buoy mooring authorities in this area.

(Note: The establishment of additional buoy moorings at this site is subject to a range of factors; for example, vessel character, natural occurrences such as ongoing shoaling, and marine development.)
