

# Improving navigational access at Canaipa Passage

The Gold Coast Waterways Authority is improving access to the waterways by dredging the navigation channel at Canaipa Passage.

Located at Canaipa Passage, South of Russell Island and West of North Stradbroke, this project involves:-

- Dredging of the Canaipa Passage navigation channel
- Beach nourishment on the foreshore of North Stradbroke Island at Slipping Sands

A conceptual plan is shown overleaf identifying the areas of the waterways that will be dredged and the location for the beach nourishment.

#### **Benefits**

- Maintain safe navigable depths in the Canaipa Passage navigation channel
- For protection and replenishment of eroded foreshore areas at North Stradbroke Island at Slipping Sands

### **Impacts**

- A dredge will operate in the waterway including a floating pipeline which may restrict waterways access during the construction works period (approx. four weeks), however, the channel will remain open for all craft.
- Dredge material discharged onto the foreshore may initially have a dark dirty appearance, however, the discolouration will quickly clear through bleaching by the sun and wave/tide action.
