



## Fast Facts Boykambil mooring area

**ABOUT:** The Boykambil mooring area is a category 3 area located at the mouth of Coombabah Creek between the Coomera River (South Branch) and Saltwater Creek. Most the area falls within a designated mooring area (DMA) of the Moreton Bay Marine Park.

**CURRENT MOORINGS IN THE AREA:** There are currently 5 traditional buoy moorings in the mooring area.

**FUTURE CAPACITY:** The Department of Environment and Science (DES) is yet to review designated mooring areas of the Moreton Bay Marine Park for alignment with historic mooring areas. This means the future mooring capacity of this mooring area to the north of the red line shown on the map remains uncertain, at this time.

**IMPORTANT:** GCWA's Buoy Mooring Review in 2014 identified instances where GCWA buoy mooring areas did not align with designated mooring areas within the Moreton Bay Marine Park and/or with the current management of declared fish habitat areas. GCWA and DES are working together to resolve these issues, which involves a legislative review process and public consultation by DES. In the interim, GCWA is unable to grant new buoy mooring authorities outside of current designated mooring areas.

*Note: The establishment of buoy moorings in this area may be affected by several factors, such as preservation of the creek's channel for navigation, environmental values of the marine park, sand movements and shoaling, other water traffic, potential road widening, and future marine development.*
