



## Fast Facts Currigee mooring area

**ABOUT:** The Currigee mooring area is a category 3 area in the Broadwater near the western shore of South Stradbroke Island within a designated mooring area (DMA) of the Moreton Bay Marine Park.

**CURRENT MOORINGS IN THE AREA:** There are currently 39 buoy moorings in the mooring area, all of which are environmentally friendly moorings.

**FUTURE CAPACITY:** For this mooring area, there would seem to be enough space and depth for up to 50 environmentally friendly moorings, depending on the type, length and draft of the moored vessels. However, because of the mooring area's location, together with the heavy obligations on vessel owners under marine safety legislation, this mooring area may only be practical for use by residents on South Stradbroke Island. GCWA will also consider residents' property access needs when deciding locations for buoy moorings nearest the foreshore.

*Note: The establishment of buoy moorings in this area requires careful consideration to a person's capacity to fully satisfy obligations under the Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994, and may also be affected by several factors, such as sand movements and shoaling, other water traffic, and marine development.*
